



outgoing Afghan clown and makes the most of any opportunity to sparkle and entertain judge and spectators. Yes, keep up the good work and SMILE as you progress with your jumping and retrieving. Here are many more chances to enjoy!

A short note from Gayle Pamela Bendick with some score corrections on her recently reported legs on Yours Truly Gabrielle. The right scores are 193 (not 194) and 196½ (not 197) which were given her by Gabby's co-owner. This correction was requested by Gayle.

Alan Bugbee (Ind.) was proud to report that his Afghan, Desert Beauty, finished her requirements for her CDX at the Queen City Obedience Trial on Nov. 7 under Judge Evelyn Lakes. He now plans to take his male, Sharif, into Open in February. Good luck, Alan!

A word about obedience clinics: be careful! If you attend one, please use good judgement and don't take everything you hear as gospel. Its best to observe and try things on your hound and see if they work for the basic type and temperament you are dealing with.

Afghan Hounds are known for their independence - which outsiders tend to confuse with stupidity. That's one thing Afghans are not, and this is precisely the point where you need to take the peculiarities of your Afghans temperament into account when applying general training methods. Some will openly flaunt their 'improvements' on





Down to the ABC of it...

A 'Novice' Approach to the Need for more Information on the Working Anatomy of the Afghan Hound

THE HEAD - PART II


Heads or Tails? Heads inevitably win. In 'Show' animals, the head, neck, and shoulders, in that order, are prime focal points to judges and casual observers alike. Despite the fact that consideration of shoulder, neck and then head might be a more intelligent and (according to the Standard) a more 'correct' approach in assessing an individual hounds worth, it remains common knowledge that the head, being most obvious, is FIRST to capture the eye, FIRST to be looked at, and tends to receive far more attention than the rest of the body. Often the first place dog is likely to possess 'less body' than one would expect of a hunting hound and often major and minor faults seem 'easily hidden' behind an impressive and expressive head.

To say that a beautiful head and attractive neck is not a major asset that contributes to the all-around balanced effect desired in all our hounds would indeed be totally out of line. An ideal situation is created when the head is proportionately balanced with the rest of the body, thereby producing an Afghan Hound whose parts 'work together'. An Afghan Hound whose parts work together purposefully can be called a functional hound. In our own Afghan Hounds, we must expect the aesthetic and demand the realistic -- all hounds to be judged wisely with the purpose of the original in mind.


In last month's 'Introduction', you were given four examples of the complex structures of the head. We will continue by breaking down these complex structures into their component parts and consider the major functions of these parts.

The head of the Afghan Hound must be functional; a weak head on a strong body is a hindrance as is a

EXAMPLE 1 - A Balanced Head




EXAMPLE 2 - A Less Balanced Head

heavy head on a light body. Working animals afflicted by such imbalance must make the best of this handicap or pay the price of ending up as his foe's dinner. Few of our hounds need worry. However, what is the purpose of breeding animals if not to produce a hound who could, if necessary, function in the field. The 'balanced' head, along with good conformation of the neck, influences an animal's speed, but more so his gait. Although one could not consider the handicap of an imbalanced head highly critical, this fact is sufficient to 'back up' the argument for proper balance because: (1) it does slow up the animal during the long run, and (2) it does affect the position at which the head is habitually carried. (Namely seen in the 'show' gait).

The head and the neck together constitute the major influence in maintaining the equilibrium as they shift the center of gravity from side to side in turns, and as they rise and fall on abrupt stops and lunges at the prey. While running, the Afghan Hound forces the head and neck forward, thereby throwing his weight forward to increase his speed. If the hound wishes to stop quickly, head and neck go up, throwing the center of gravity backward. The longer the head and neck, the greater the forward center of gravity when momentum is increased. Short heads and necks lessen this effect.

In summation, the general structure of the head will depend on breed and purpose. The characteristic Afghan head would indeed be streamlined as this is advantageous to speed. It would also be strong and not snipey, as this quality enhances the hound's ability to catch and hold his prey.

BOOK finds

Afghans of Cyndhar

After the 20 yr hiatus between the first and second British Afghan Hound books, it's quite a surprise to find that another one has just been published. The book, entitled **THE AFGHAN HOUND**, is written by William Hall, who has bred and shown Afghans in England under the Barbille prefix. (Published by John Gifford, Ltd., London). The book seems to be aimed primarily at the first-Afghan owner, providing only the most basic information required for the novice to cope with his new acquisition.

As this basically novice approach might suggest, there is relatively little new information available in the book that hasn't been gone into in more detail in other books. The author has some opinions which many may find nearly heretical (to wit: ...we prefer to sell an Afghan for life in a town flat to the coun-

try home'.) and there are some mistakes in the book which are rather funny. (Rather than provide extensive detail about the history of the breed, the author suggests that 'all this is discussed in much greater detail by Mr. Gilbert Miller in his much bigger book on the breed...!') The standard topics (history, buying a puppy, breeding care, showing, the Standard, ailments, etc.) are all covered, but generally quite briefly.

The author does offer one thing which many of us are continually looking for -- a few new pictures of Afghans of 20 or 30 years ago. Among the most interesting are a group picture of 5 early Carloway dogs (only one of which has appeared in another book), one of the few available photos of Ch. Horningsea Majid (unfortunately

not a very good one), and a handsome head study of Ch. Bletchingley Tajomeer. There are also several new pictures of dogs which have appeared in other poses in different books. There is a color photo on the cover which has not appeared before, but which is perversely unidentified.

The book is written entirely for a British reading public, and for a time, at least, it is unlikely to be available here.** This British orientation leads to a fairly extensive use of brand names which are not familiar to American readers, as well as occasional reference to British idioms which are none too clear (what, exactly, is an 'old woolly jumper'?)

For all of the book's weaknesses, a new breed book IS an event. If you're like me, it's still hard to resist.

EDSEL & I...

OR THE CONTRIBUTIONS OF
ROMAYNE SWITCH TOWARD
THE UNDERSTANDING OF THE
BEHAVIOR OF OUR HOUNDS

Its been a year since Edsel followed the rising sun over the hills of Houn' Hollow and presented the Afghan World with his interpretation of MURPHY'S LAW - that magical formula for mistakes that states that 1 plus 1 equals "two,(") being the symbol for HARDLY EVER. This year Edsel has more to offer.

Now Edsel is a "regular" guy who manifests all the needs and drives and urges we all feel at one time or another. Edsel realizes that most of us spend most of our time making excuses for things we have or have not done. Edsel too feels the strain of justifying his actions - just as you and I do. Edsel feels the need to be loved and knows how you feel when the world "puts you down". Edsel is constantly being prodded by his conscience to do bigger and better things. And because Edsel cares and is attentive to your needs, he eagerly presents his New Years offering -- not in the much abused form of a New Year's Resolution, but as an article of faith whose tenet revives and refreshes your shattered ego and enables you to "hassle it out" and "hang in there" with the best of them. (THEM= BTO's and BSA's - and I don't mean Boy Scouts of America!!!)

Here it is New Year 1972 with Edsel "master of the mistake" introducing ... an excuse for making excuses ... the Peter Principle* which states "in

a hierarchy every employee tends to rise to his level of incompetence." Peter's Principle can't do much to increase your knowledge on the subject of EPIMELETIC BEHAVIOR which, by the way, is our topic for the month, but it can reinforce your ego, hide your incompetence, improve your disposition, reactivate your social status and improve your "amateur standing" with other excuse makers...BTOs and BSAs..... and allow you to waste just enough time to throw casual acquaintances, judges, friends, and enemies off the track, allowing you time to change the subject, or the mood and become "master of the moment."

While you and Edsel are thinking about that, I'll get with it in the giving and care and attention department...Epimeletic Behavior. Epimeletic Behavior is also known as maternal behavior and is strongly influenced by the maternal hormone, PROTACTIN. Epimeletic behavior is first exhibited in nest-making prior to whelping, and includes in its range of normality the pushing away or burying of weak or dying puppies, despite the fact that distress vocalization is exhibited by the puppies. The retrieving of normal, healthy puppies who make known their whereabouts by distress vocalizing triggers the opposite response, and the mother reacts by licking the puppy's face so that it can reorientate itself and crawl in the direction of the stimulus.

If a bitch has been taken away from her litter, upon returning, typical

Epimeletic Behavior would have her walk toward the puppies, nose them (causing much confusion and noise) and lie down on her side with her feet toward them. Cosily settled, she begins nosing and licking each puppy, thereby stimulating urination and defecation. This behavior contributes much to 'good housekeeping' as the mother cleans up after the pups until they are approximately 3 weeks old and can move to the farthest corner of their box to relieve themselves. A good mother will still clean a soiled pup, but otherwise the puppies are on their own. Most mothers are passive as to the position the puppies choose at the milk bar, but I have seen individuals rearrange the seating plan more to their taste. This is an exception rather than a rule. As puppies grow up, these peculiar behavior patterns tend to fade and are replaced by others. Some of our more instinctive mothers, at the onset of weaning (about 3 to 4 wks) may regurgitate food in order to introduce the pups to solids. However this is seen less when weaning is aided by human effort, and weakening of this pattern does not seem to cause serious consequences. As they grow older, puppies will often try to nurse standing up but at this point the maternal instinct begins to fade into an abrupt cessation of all nursing activity, and maternal behavior is channeled to "separating" activities such as rough play, punishing and avoiding contact with the puppies.

We witness another aspect of Epimeletic Behavior in what is termed Pseudopregnancy at which time the female exhibits nest-making activities, lactation and even first stage labor along with a displaced maternal protection of woolly toy or other inanimate objects. Another set of patterns of Epimeletic Behavior concerns self grooming as dogs will lick themselves and their wounds, or scratch or bite at irritated areas. No elaborate cleaning and grooming behavior as seen in cats can be distinguished. Finally, grooming between adult animals is rare and seen usually only when one dog licks the wounds of another.

HANDY HINTS FOR HOUND OWNERS from JEANETTE CHAIX

All of us - at one time or another - have stumbled upon a time-, labor- or even better: money-saving idea. Well, here is a new department in which you can share "the wealth" with over 2000 other Afghanites.

If you're reluctant to admit to some of your more outlandish inventions, don't. Just to show you how way out they may be, here is one of mine to sort of start things off. Its for those of us who still struggle with a hand-dryer and perhaps a particularly hairy Af.

When I finally realized that I might never grow that absolutely essential third arm for the drying operation, I began to scout around for an inexpensive dryer "stand". My first attempt was a winner! I took the legs of an old ironing board, adjusted them to "dog crate level" and temporarily tied my dryer to it with a show lead. Voila, a lightweight, portable, FREE-STANDING DOG DRYER! Later I modified it to raise and lower to any level

quickly and easily by tightening or loosening a string. It has cut my drying time almost in half and helps to make "the final product" more professional looking.

Any suggestions as to what to do with the top of my ironing board will be greatly appreciated. Anyway, who likes to iron?! Three cheers for wash and wear!!

A bit less bizarre but also on the inventive side is a doggy use for the so-called "Miracle Lint Remover" brushes. They are dandy for picking up dandruff from a dog's back. Sort of a final grooming touch on a black dog in particular, though of course we believe in getting to the cause of dandruff by feeding a daily quantity of animal fat to each dog.

The third and final idea for this month brings a touch of nostalgia

as I look up at the ceiling at the long-forgotten hook over my grooming crate. How faithfully it served me with my first Afghan, before our grooming setup became a bit more 'professional'. This was a suggestion from Betty Richards, Camri Afghans. All you need is an eye screw, costing a few cents at the hardware store and a tall husband or stepladder. The screw goes into a stud in the ceiling over any table or raised surface suitable for standing your dog on. Now you need a length of rope or better, a benching chain. Attach this to the eye screw in the ceiling. The other end attaches to your dog's choke chain and he's all set up for a grooming.





BASIC FIRST AID FOR THE INJURED DOG

A screech of brakes, a dull thud, a yelp - and maybe the driver did, maybe he didn't stop to see what he hit. What can YOU do to help?

First of all, realize that an injured animal - even your own - is frightened if not panicky, and may bite anyone who is trying to help. Therefore, before you try to check on any injuries, make a muzzle from any soft yet sturdy material, such as a nylon stocking, neck tie, belt, etc. Use it to make a large loop which you can slip over the dog's muzzle, then tighten it sufficiently to give you control, but also allow the dog to breathe freely. Tie the ends behind the dog's ears. As you perform this basic precaution, keep in mind that the dog's jaw may be injured, so be firm BUT gentle. While you are handling his muzzle check if the membranes of his mouth are pale, which would indicate that he is in shock. Other indications are vomiting and/or irregular breathing. In that case, rushing your dog to the nearest vet is of utmost importance.

Try to get a coat, blanket or towel under the dog on which to carry him to the car. This will minimize the aggravation of internal injuries. Put the injured animal on the floor rather than on a seat in your car, so he will not fall off. Cover him with anything you have handy that may keep him warm.

If the dog does not appear to be in shock, you may first want to move him out of the street to safety - again using a coat or blanket as a make-shift litter - and check for external, bleeding wounds or fractures. Severe bleeding may be stopped by applying makeshift bandages from any soft, clean material. Light bleeding may be ignored for the time being, until it is safe to move the dog and use an antiseptic or medicated spray for first aid treatment.

To check for fractures, see if any limbs are in an unnatural position, or gently extend each leg and watch for indications of pain which

would suggest a fracture. In that case, before moving the animal, you may want to make a splint for the broken limb. If you cannot find a piece of wood (or even pencil for a small breed), you may find a section of your newspaper serviceable. Make a tight roll of it and apply it along the leg like a splint, then tie it with a bandage or any tie, strip of cloth, etc. you may have handy.

Needless to say, the next step in any case is a quick appointment with your vet. If the injured dog is not yours, however, you may find it impossible to secure veterinary aid, as your vet might leave himself open to lawsuits from the animal's owner for treating an animal without owner's consent.

In some areas, you will get emergency service from the local animal shelter. In others, a call to the police department may set the proper machinery in motion to get authorized veterinary help. Consequently, it seems like a good idea to familiarize yourself on general principle with the rules which govern the emergency first aid situation in your area.

FROM OUR READERS --

An article appeared in "Our Afghan" magazine, November 1972 issue by E. M. Gilbert, Jr. concerning the clipping, trimming and otherwise un-natural state of an Afghans coat in the show ring. He states the ideal goals of the breeder, exhibitor and judge and then goes on to say "that these groups are composed of fallible human beings" who forget the standard when the goal is winning. He further states that the "breeder and/or exhibitor can do professional clipping and trimming that can't be detected by the judge." Since the judge can not spot our bad deeds, the method by which we present our hounds is controlled completely by our code of ethics. Each of us is given a brain and a conscience and each of us has the right to decide the type of standard we will live by. Therefore, in essence, who has the right to tell us how to ice the cake!

I was always under the impression that the ingredients that go into a cake are far more important than the icing that covers it. The icing serves as an appetizer to the visual senses and if the cake is a flop, the icing will not save it. Is this not true with the coat of an Afghan? Sure, a little trimming her and a little plucking there may enhance the silhouette of an Afghan, but when the judge JUDGES AS HE SHOULD and runs his hand over the dog, no amount of trimming or scissoring will alter the structure or movement underneath.

It is about time that more attention be geared toward the elimination of the crippled mover in the ring? Proper reach and drive is practically extinct, and the hackney poney gait has replaced it. What is even sadder is the fact that the judges condone this inexcusable movement by putting dogs up that possess this fault.

I feel us bakers (breeders) should pay more attention to the ingredients that go into making a near perfect cake (hound) and once we have achieved this goal, we can concern ourselves with the icing that goes over the finished product.

Here comes another letter from "far off" Alaska. This time I'm writing in regard to your article on Raspberry Leaf Tea.

I have just delivered two litters of Af puppies, one litter of 10 and the other of 9. As for Mother Nature, and changing plans, I was totally unprepared, but things are working out just fine.

Now about the tea. I started feeding the tea (dry, mixed in the food) 2 1/2 weeks before the due date from the first breeding.

The first bitch started into whelp at 12 p.m.

Thursday (Nov. 11, 61 days), and after 6 P.O.P. shots and two trips to the vet (one at 11:30 p.m.) she finally had 9 beautiful puppies. The tenth was born sometime during the night (we knew it was there, but shots didn't move it out.)

The second bitch went into whelp about 11:30 p.m. Saturday (Nov. 13, 63 days). The first puppy was born at 5 a.m. Sunday. At 8:45 a.m. two more puppies were born in the car while driving to the vet. Two more were born when we returned from the vet. (The vet is a 40 mile round trip). The last of the litter of 9 was born at 3 p.m. Sunday afternoon. No P.O.P. shots were used with this bitch. This bitch, with her first litter, required a "C" section. That was my prime reason for using the tea with her.

The only thing I can say about the tea's effects is that the labor—when there was any—was so easy, the bitches had no discomfort. In fact, I never knew when either one was going to have a puppy, they just slid out.

My vet commented that he had NEVER seen a bitch have a puppy that wasn't in the birth canal. The puppies were born directly from the uterus in one effort. Maryana (1st. bitch) was at the vets and he examined her and could find no puppies even near the canal. But 3 minutes after the 1st. P.O.P shot, she had a puppy, and 10 minutes after that another. The doctor just couldn't believe his eyes. He couldn't even detect contractions.

I could go on and on, but let me say that my

Had a bitch brought to me for grooming...18 months old, a beautiful apricot and NEVER groomed in her life. The owner said she didn't like to be groomed and she DIDN'T WANT TO UPSET HER. Did you ever want to strangle someone—Oh, did she come close!! Well, after making no promises and quoting an unheard of price, she agreed to leave her with me, till such time as I could perform a miracle.

ONE mat—from nose to tail—couldn't even get a fingernail into it. I worked on her three to four hours a day, muttering darkly into my

beard (luckily I have a beard) for twenty-four days. I used only a small slicker brush, working from the outside, into the undercoat, very, very carefully and then a long tooth comb. Each day, I would just go over the parts I had done previously, and then tackle a new (ugh) area. 

FROM OUR READERS

To The Editor:

I am appalled at the number of Afghan owners who buy a good show prospect, treat it as a loving pet, and when show day arrives go out to the back yard, take freshly bathed Prospect off his 15 foot tie-out chain, snap a show lead on him, and with a 30 minute superficial brushing expect a winner to emerge.

Certainly I would rather sell or give away my stock to persons who will make loving pets of them rather than kennelled show dogs; for lucky is the Afghan who becomes an integral part of a loving family. However, with so many creditable dogs being shown today it is not enough to have a "good-one!" Conditioning is the difference between a quality, sound also-ran and a winner.

How often do we see judges examine their entrants for type and structure, gait initially to separate the sound quality hound from the unsound, gait the chosen group again to further weed out any degree of unsoundness; and from the ensuing few select only the four best for

placing. My contention is that IN GENERAL the remaining four are the MOVERS, those quality Afghans who either by self-conditioning (very few) or hours of roadwork "move-out" far better than their sound, show-prospect littermates confined to tie-out chains and living room couches. Yes! you CAN breed structural soundness into a dog, but for most home-loving Afghans it takes hours of conditioning to make a MOVER!

It is no longer a question of being able to buy a good dog to win—it is a question of conditioning that good dog; developing him to his fullest potential. Certainly he must be fed properly to insure good solid muscle with no trace of excess fat to obscure hipbones and round the croup; he must be groomed to perfection, taking care to eliminate ALL mats, particularly (1) behind his ears as those mats tend to lift his ears upward and outward making him appear grossly broad in backskull and ruining his houndy expression, and (2) between his chest and front legs and in his groin, for those mats, however small, produce stilted movement and lack of reach and drive in

an otherwise sound and good moving hound.

Agreed, breeding alone is responsible for basic structure, initial temperament, and genetic quality and quantity of coat. Conditioning alone is responsible for developing that structure, enriching that temperament (love being the conditioner here), and conditioning that coat to its fullest by nurturing every strand. Without this time consuming conditioning by a dedicated and energetic owner, it is almost impossible to obtain a winner from a show prospect.

Today we are winning with show dogs, not pets; and while all Afghans can be pets, not all pets are show prospects; nor do all show prospects become show dogs; and therein lies the difference! Yes, it is very nice to have a winner, but if you want to treat your show prospect like a pet; if you are too lazy to frequently condition him, his coat, his movement; realize that no wizardry, no amount of handling expertise will remodel your show prospect into a show dog. Don't accuse Prospect's breeder of selling you an inferior specimen while he is conditioning the coat and roadworking the littermate while you sit in front of the T.V. It isn't necessarily that one pup is superior compared to the other, it just could be that the one pup has been fully developed; for not always is what you see, what you get.


We have, by now, received a good dozen copies of a personalized pitch to various Afghan kennels

Meantime the full-page, heart-tugging "Dear Santa" ads from the puppy palaces - like the one Donna Kelley sent us from Chicago - tell us only too well that we are a long ways from that happy day.
